Naxos Yesterday and Today Island Tour

On today's adventure, you will explore the quaint village of Damalas, where a traditional pottery workshop awaits.

Witness the transformative process as the ceramist molds clay into exquisite art. Continuing to the southwest, explore olive oil production at the village's restored press, offering insights into a bygone way of life.

Venture to Halki to visit Vallindras Distillery, the birthplace of the renowned Kitron liqueur. Discover the paleochristian church of Panagia Drosiani, dating back to the 4th-6th centuries, before exploring the charming village of Apiranthos with its marble-paved alleys and rich traditions. Conclude your journey in Flerio, where remnants of antiquity, including the 7th-century BC Kouros statue, highlight the region's historical significance.

Apollo Island Tour

Traverse the picturesque Apiranthos village with its marble-paved alleys, rich culture, and majestic views. Head to Apollonas, a historic Naxian port, now a fishing village, and discover the ancient marble quarry with the colossal Kouros statue. Finally, visit Eggares, exploring the 19th-century olive press, delving into the island's past and vanishing way of life.

Visit a traditional grocery store, then conclude your stroll with a visit to a charming wine bar guided by a passionate owner through a Greek wine-tasting session.




Cheese and Wine Trails

Explore the authentic Naxian life with a journey through the traditional tastes and aromas of Naxos, offering a unique chance to meet locals and immerse yourself in the island's culture.

Venture into the heart of Naxos to a small cheese farm, witnessing the traditional process of crafting renowned Naxian cheeses like the signature "arseniko."

Engage with friendly farmers, feed animals, and indulge in farm-fresh delights. Continue to a family-run vineyard, where the owner guides you through the rustic vines, sharing insights on terroir and winemaking methods.

Conclude with a delightful tasting of five local wines, expertly paired with Naxian cheeses, fostering a rich exchange of life experiences.





Traditional Cooking Class

Today's experience unfolds in a charming hilltop setting offering panoramic views of the sea and the farming lands of southwest Naxos.

Explore a small dairy facility owned by a young couple who tend to their vegetable garden and animals. Immerse yourself in the culinary arts as Yannis, the farmer, guides guests in milking goats, crafting cheese, and preparing a delightful meal over an open fire.

Katerina, his wife, shares the secrets of cooking local recipes with fresh ingredients. Conclude the experience by gathering under the shade of an olive tree to savor the feast.



Naxos Wine Tour

In this unique experience you will visit two family vineyards in two different areas of Naxos. Your first stop will be at your escort's family vineyard, where you will enjoy an informative tour of the vines and a private wine tasting.

He will then join you on your drive to the mountains of Naxos, where you will visit the second vineyard of the day, this time a 100 year old, prephylloxeravineyard, situated at an altitude of 750m and built amphitheatrically on a mountain cliff.

There you will go on a 10 minute hike and explore the differences in vines, terroir, pruning techniques etc. before you sit down to enjoy 3 samples of traditional that perfectly represents the traditional wine culture of Naxos.



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Northen Beauty, Wild & Delicious

Explore the remote part of the island, starting at a renovated olive press museum to learn about traditional olive oil production.

Taste various olive oil products before heading to the picturesque village of Koronos. Wander through its narrow streets and visit a family-owned tavern.

Continue your journey through the mountains to reach the secluded bay of Lionas for a swim and fresh seafood at a family-owned beach tavern.

Finally, stop in the charming village of Halki for a traditional coffee or dessert on your way back.



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
Hidden Vantage Point with A View

During this 4.5 km moderate hike, you will be able to discover how the inhabitants lived back in the day when they had to find shelter from pirates and immerse yourself with the traditions that have become a part of everyday life.

Accompanied by a licensed guide/instructor, you will follow the route around Danakons, one of the oldest villages on the island that remained untouched through centuries, famous for the impressive fortified Fotodotis monastery and beautiful, refreshing Danakos springs.

You will then continue towards Mt Zas, the mountain in which, according to Greek mythology, Zeus hid from his father Kronos until he was strong enough to fight the Titans.

The mountain provides a memorable panoramic view of the East Coast of the island, and plenty of photo opportunities.





The Mountain Of God Zeus

A climb to the summit of Mt. Zas, the highest peak of Cycladic islands.

Walking up the old footpath which connects Agia Marina (St. Marina) with the summit of the mountain, you will encounter interesting and rare species of fauna and flora.

During the trek, you will also have the chance to admire unique views of the Aegean Sea and the surrounding islands.

A unique experience, where you will create unforgettable memories.



Rural Landscape Amid Rocky Mountains

The starting point of this hike will be the well-known traditional village of Apeiranthos.

As you hike down the old mule trail from Apeiranthos to the emery mines, you will initially see a forested area, full of oaks and maple trees. Visit two significant churches of the area; Agios loannis Theologos, a rare example of byzantine architecture and Agia Kyriaki, one of the most important byzantine monuments in the Balkan region and a rare example of aniconic frescoes. The natural setting varies along the way and as you get closer to the bridge, the landscape becomes rugged.

On your way back to the village, cross a fertile piece of land, full of olive groves and vineyards. This is a hike of geological and geomorphological interest. You will also get to savor some snacks and refreshments at a local Kafeneio.
