



Private Guide Service: Dubrovnik and its Golden Age, Walking Tour

Description: This tour is a real treat for visitors who want to see beyond the obvious and explore the architecture and history of Dubrovnik and the golden age of the Dubrovnik Republic. Your discovery begins as you enter the Old Town accompanied by your licensed guide through the Pile or Plo?e Gate (two main entrances to the Old city). As you make your way through the pedestrian center and the famous Stradun street, you will visit the Church of Holy Salvation, a grandiose Franciscan and Dominican church, crown jewels of Dubrovnik, Knezev Dvor, the Rector's Palace, Old port, vibrant town squares, monuments, and fountains. One of the highlights of your walking tour is the famous Pharmacy located within the Franciscan Monastery, built in 1317. Inside is a fascinating collection of decorated jars filled with ancient remedies; unique measurement devices, together with alembics and mortars. The Monastery, which also houses a museum with an excellent art collection, took a century to build and was almost destroyed in the tragic earthquake of 1667. City walls around the Old city are an entirely private part of the tour - guides do not go up, but if you wish to embark on an exploration of the monumental walls it is definitely a worthwhile experience and a pleasant 2-hour walk. Water and SPF are recommended, especially during the summer months.

Private Tour with Car: Montenegro and Kotor Bay Natural Beauty Tour

Description: Your private English speaking driver will pick you up at the arranged meeting time at your hotel in Dubrovnik and start your tour by heading towards Zupa Dubrovacka and the Konavle valley up to the border with Montenegro (about an hour from Dubrovnik). The road winds its way through the towns of Risan and Perast. The town of Perast is famous for its beautiful islet called "Gospa od Skrpjela" (Our Lady of Stone) and you will stop to explore the town and bask in the glorious view. The panoramic ride to Kotor is giving you a chance to experience Montenegro's three different landscapes - bay, mountain, and sea. There are very few places that compare to the natural beauty of the Bay of Kotor, which is a fiord, often compared to the ones in Norway. The city itself is surrounded by a very preserved medieval wall. You'll have free time to explore Kotor where you will be able to visit the city's historical museum, or just enjoy walking the rambling narrow streets and alleys or interacting with the locals in one of many cafes along the boardwalk. Kotor is a UNESCO protected historic town well known for its rich history, nautical tradition and the famous merchant navy of Boka Kotorska.

Private Transfer: Transfer from Dubrovnik to Split with Stops on Biokovo Skywalk, Klis, Omis

Description: After meeting your driver-guide at the hotel you will embark on a journey to Split filled with beautiful rest stops, perfect photo opportunities, and unforgettable views. Along the way, you will drive up to the top of Biokovo Nature Park and visit the newly opened Skywalk, a horseshoe-shaped platform out off the cliff with a glass walkway that will provide you with the most spectacular views of Makarska, Dalmatian coast, and Central Dalmatian islands. Continuing towards Split, your next destination will be the picturesque seaside town of Omis, perfectly nestled between the Adriatic sea and the dramatic canyon of the river Cetina. Last but not least, you will visit the historic Klis fortress that overlooks the entire bay of Split and provides you with panoramic views of Split, Kastela, and Trogir. Once the home of kings and one of the most important defense fortresses, you can now wander around the grounds unencumbered by ropes or locked doors. After you have explored this magnificent structure, your driver will take you to an ethnic village nearby, a carefully built replica of an authentic Dalmatian village which is also known for the production of traditional delicacies, lush botanical garden, olive oil museum, and great food. You will have a chance to relax and have lunch in the village before heading to your hotel in Split.

Following world culinary trends, the hotel's restaurant and bar meet various nutritional needs of the guests and offer vegetarian, vegan, and gluten-free meals.





Private Tour with Car: Tour to Split, Salona and Trogir

Description: Embark on a tour of three exceptional historical towns Split, Trogir and Salona, all located within a 30 km stretch of the Dalmatian coast. After your transfer from the hotel to the Split city center, you will meet your private guide and step inside the UNESCO World Heritage Site Diocletian's Palace, one of the world's most impressive Roman monuments built for the Roman emperor Diocletian at the turn of the fourth century AD. Wander through the still very lively narrow streets inside the palace, explore the grandiose palace cellars, the 4 palace gates, the Jewish Ghetto, rub the toe of the Grgur Ninski statue and learn more about the fascinating history of the city and the infamous Emperor. Your history lesson will continue with a visit to Salona, the capital of the Roman province of Dalmatia some 2000 years ago, and one of the five largest cities in the entire Roman empire. Explore the large Roman amphitheater which was fit for a city of 60.000 at its peak, Manastirine, a necropolis that was used from the 2nd century BC until the destruction of the city in the 7th century, and many other sites within this live archaeological park. Your next destination is Trogir, a small island town that was founded by the ancient Greek settlers in the 3rd century BC. Trogir is an excellent example of a medieval town built on and conforming with the layout of a Hellenistic and Roman city that has conserved its urban with the minimum of modern interventions, earning it the status of a UNESCO World Heritage Site. For centuries, Trogir was a place where numerous artists left their mark, leaving an imprint inside the city's soul. From its famous St. Laurence Cathedral portal to the Venetian fortifications used to fight off the invaders, this small city will leave a lasting impression.

Entrance Fees for Krka National Park

Description: After breakfast, your driver will meet you at the hotel and start your1.5 h drive towards Krka National Park. Once you arrive, you will be joined by your private guide who will show you all the highlights of the park including the Ethnographic collection, Old crafts exhibition, Old mills on Krka river and of course the Skradinski Buk Waterfalls. You will then continue to Sibenik, a city founded by the Croatian King Petar Krešimir IV in the 11th century. For a while, the city was the seat of Croatian kings. Wander through the narrow streets and explore the beautiful St. James Cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage site, which took over 100 years to build. This building stands as a monument to the people of Šibenik and their determination and it is a must see when you are in the area. After a short tour of Sibenik, you will continue towards your final destination of the day, your hotel in Zadar.











Private Tour with Car: Plitvice Lakes National Park Tour


